(D) Day 2: Wed., June 5 - Whitehorse:

Today we will explore the town, starting





with a visit to the Whitehorse Fish Ladder. It is the world's longest wooden fish ladder that helps migrating Chinook salmon on the final leg of their journey. We will visit the McBride Museum of Yukon History and learn about the local history and folklore of Sam Magee. Then it is on to the Yukon Beringia Interpretive Centre, S.S. Klondike Paddle Wheeler & photo stops. Later this afternoon there will be free time to go shopping, hike one of the great trails along the Yukon River, explore the town or perhaps just relax with a good book. (B &D)

Day 3: Thurs., June 6 - Whitehorse: Today we will travel to Haines Junction and explore Kluane National Park & Reserve. We will return in the late afternoon to Whitehorse. (B & L)

Day 4: Fri., June 7 - Dawson City: Following the same basic route as the old prospectors of the Klondike Gold Rush we will drive to Dawson City, our home for the next two nights.
